On February 21st, Delaware County Veterans Memorial Chairman Nick DeBenedictis of Aqua America, Inc., along with Delaware County Councilman Mario Civera and PA State Representative Nick Miccarelli, co hosted an invitation only summit meeting for Local CEOs, representatives from various charitable organizations, educators, and political and community leaders. The event took place at Aqua's headquarters in Bryn Mawr. Also in attendance were DCVMA President Guy Fizzano, who served in the US Army and is co-owner of Fizzano Brothers Concrete Products; the Memorial's Founding Member Linda Houldin; and land donor and contributor Claude de Botton.

The guests joined together to learn about what will be one of the country's most ambitious Veterans Memorials and to help with the fundraising effort to complete its construction. There are very few forums that serve both to honor Veterans and to educate visitors, much less those that do it in such a dynamic and awe inspiring way.

The design, donated by Architect George Matuszewski, is extraordinary in its symbolism and features. As it was explained at the event, the Memorial seeks to personalize each visitor's experience through the first-hand war time experiences of those defending our way of life. The actual words of Presidents, Generals and those that served in each War will be engraved on the nine mammoth granite columns that form the outer ring of the Memorial.

The names of those Delaware County heroes who made the ultimate sacrifice and all Newtown Square residents who served will be engraved on the sleek black granite walls forming the interior portion of the Memorial. Underlying it all will be grounds covered by bricks inscribed with messages of love, remembrance and thanks purchased by people just like me and you.

Although the event's attendees may make significant contributions to forever have their business or organization associated with this grass roots project, their generosity alone is not enough to see the project through to completion. Other group and individual participation is imperative in creating this most impressive destination point for their own community. This timeless community landmark needs a community to build it. Hopefully, the general public and corporate sponsors will contribute to the making of history.

It is certainly not too late to help support the effort or to get involved with fundraising for the Delaware County Veterans Memorial. General Meeting Minutes – 5 March 2012

Commandant: Commandant Jim Herbst opened the meeting at 1930. The normal opening ceremonies were conducted, and visitors from other Detachments and veterans' organizations were recognized. Officers present were Commandant Jim Herbst, Sr. Vice Bob Cosgrove, Jr. Vice Jack McLeod, Judge Advocate Paul Ferguson, Adjutant Jack Kelly, Paymaster Bob Spano, Chaplain Chris Bush, Sergeant-at-Arms Bud Davis, Service Officer Con McGinley, Director Bill Kinney, Director Bernie McGinley, and Junior Past Commandant Dan Luty.

Minutes: George Boyajian made a motion to accept the minutes of the 6 February 2012 general meeting as published in the *Scuttlebutt*. Joe Mensack seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Officers' Reports:

Commandant's Report: Jim Herbst reported that the recent recognition of Iwo Jima veterans that was held at the Delaware County Detachment went very well. Three members of our Detachment, Lou Camilli, Walt Tallmadge, and Don Walz, were among the Iwo Jima veterans present, and we also had a good showing of other members from the Detachment. Jim Herbst reminded the membership to review the list of upcoming events noted on the meeting's agenda. He also mentioned that he would be on vacation from 7 March to 11 March 2012.

Sr. Vice: Bob Cosgrove reported that the first Detachment breakfast had been conducted on 11 February 2012 and twelve members had a nice breakfast at Joe's Pizza in Broomall. He mentioned that a second breakfast would be held this Saturday, 10 March 2012 at the Country Squire Restaurant in Broomall. He encouraged the membership to come out for a good breakfast and some good camaraderie. He also inquired about interest in a Phillies – Giants baseball game on 20 July 2012. He indicated he would send out an e-mail for those interested in signing up for the game. Other possible social events suggested were a trip to the Battleship New Jersey, the annual air show in Reading, PA, and a possible bus trip to Marine Barracks at 8th and I Streets in Washington, D.C.

Adjutant: Jack Kelly reported that letters of acknowledgment of donations made by the Detachment had been received from the St. Vincent DePaul Society, the Liberty USO at the Philadelphia International Airport, the Fisher House Foundation, the Semper FI Fund, the Navy- Marine Corps Relief Society, and the American Gold Star Mothers. A letter of thanks was received from the Upper Providence Senior Citizen's Club for the Americanism presentation that was recently presented by Earle Drake, Jim Mulhern, and Lloyd Spangler. Jack Kelly also read a card of thanks from Helene Barner, thanking the members of the Detachment for the gift certificate that had been presented to Wayne and Helene Barner for their dedicated work on the Honor Guard over the past few years.

Jr. Vice: Jack McLeod provided some personal comments and recognition for Chaplain Chris Bush who assisted Jack McLeod after his recent hospitalization, and Jack also praised Chris Bush for his dedication as Detachment Chaplain. Jack McLeod also thanked Tom McGovern for his dedicated work over the years in the Help Us Help Others (HUHO) campaign. It was announced that the Springfield Walmart has indicated that the Detachment will be able to hold HUHO events at that store. Jack McLeod also mentioned that Certificates of Appreciation are being delivered to those stores that permitted the Detachment to solicit funds under our HUHO campaign last year. Jack McLeod mentioned that Acme markets had donated \$6,600.00 to the Detachment from the Acme Charitable Trust Fund for a misunderstanding on HUHO dates last year.

Judge Advocate: Paul Ferguson read a change to Administrative Procedure B4, in reference to the Toys for Tots Chairman Duties and Responsibilities. Item #5, reading "He will accept no monetary donations but refer those inquiring about same to the Reserve District" has been deleted from the Administrative Procedure. This had been discussed at a recent Officers' Staff Meeting, and approved. It was read to the membership and since it was only an administrative change, a vote by the membership was not necessary.

Chaplain: Chris Bush reported that Bill DiIenno recently had one of his legs amputated above the knee. He is at Bryn Mawr Hospital, but may soon be moved to another facility.

Paymaster: Bob Spano provided the paymaster's report as of 29 February 2012. George Boyajian made a motion to accept the paymaster's report as received. Paul Ferguson seconded the motion and the motion passed. Bob Spano also asked the membership to review the suggested organizations for donations, to be considered later in the meeting.

Service Officer: Con McGinley mentioned that the next bingo game at the Coatesville VA Medical Center is scheduled for 12 March 2012. There is also a St. Patrick's Day party there on 14 March 2012.

Committee Reports:

Americanism: Earle Drake reported that an Americanism program is being set up for the St. Joseph's School in Downingtown, PA. Tom Tanner and several members from the Chester County Detachment may also be involved with this presentation.

Adopt-a-Highway: John Burfete mentioned that the first Adopt-a-Highway event is scheduled for 15 April 2012. Notification will be sent out by e-mail as the date approaches.

Awards: Harry Kaufman mentioned that 17 February was the anniversary of the first day for the battle of Iwo Jima during World War II. He mentioned that the Pennsylvania House of Representatives had provided a Certificate of Recognition to several of our members who are veterans of the battle of Iwo Jima, thanking them for their service. Harry Kaufman presented the Certificate to Don Walz, who was in attendance at the meeting. The other veterans of Iwo Jima will receive their certificates at a later date.

Color Guard: Bill Kinney reported for Jim Donegan that the Color Guard will be marching in the Springfield St. Patrick's Day parade on 17 March 2012. Several volunteers are needed for this event. He also mentioned that the Honor Flight to Washington, D.C. is scheduled for 14 April 2012.

Honor Guard: Ben Sides reported that the Honor Guard participated in 13 military funerals for deceased veterans during February. The total for the year so far is 30 military funerals. Ben Sides also requested that Honor Guard participants see him after the close of the general meeting for a short meeting.

Marksmanship: Earle Drake reported that a District pistol match is scheduled for Saturday 12 May 2012. This is a Marine Corps League sanctioned event. Interested shooters should contact Paul Drinkard or Earle Drake for additional information.

Delaware County Veterans Memorial Park: Bill Kinney provided a brief overview of the progress at the park. He showed an artist's rendition of the completed project, and he mentioned that the steel work has been completed and the block work is underway. He mentioned that bricks for sale could still be purchased for the recognition of veterans from Delaware County, PA. The anticipated completion date of this phase of the project is 10 November 2012.

Property: Bob Spano indicated that he had a number of different patches available for purchase, as well as ribbons and ribbon bars. He also had a red blazer jacket and a red satin jacket available.

Scholarships: Wayne Williams mentioned that he has application forms for National, State, and Detachment scholarships. Interested members should contact Wayne Williams for the application forms.

Toys for Tots: Bob Cosgrove mentioned that he is preparing the Certificates of Appreciation for those stores that participated in the Toys for Tots program last year.

Help Our Heroes: John Burfete reported on the progress of the Help Our Heroes campaign. He reported that an additional \$600.00 had been submitted as contributions just this evening.

Unfinished Business: No items of unfinished business were raised.

New Business: The Marple Newtown Combined Veterans Alliance recognized Wayne Barner with a citation in recognition of his public service in his achievements serving with the Honor Guard. This was the highest level award that the Alliance could award, and it was awarded for Wayne Barner's leadership with the Honor Guard over the past few years.

The award was presented by Jim Herbst, Commandant of the General Smedley D. Butler Marine Corps League, and Jerry Sweeley, Commander of American Legion Post #805 in Broomall. Barry Reese, VFW Commander, was not present for the presentation. Wayne and Helene Barner are planning on moving to Lancaster County in the near future.

Announcements: Earle Drake mentioned that a District meeting is being planned, with a tentative date of 6 May 2012. The meeting will be held at the Chester County Detachment's home. Harry Kaufman mentioned that the traveling replica of the Vietnam Wall in Washington, D.C. will be in this area in June 2012. Bob Spano mentioned that Joe Clark, past Commandant of the Delaware County MCL Detachment had recently passed away. A Welcome Home parade is being organized in Media, PA, recognizing veterans of all conflicts. The parade is scheduled for 28 April 2012. This year's annual Walk for the Wounded event is scheduled for 19 May 2012. More information will follow on these upcoming events.

Good of the League: Bob Spano provided information on the organizations recommended by the officers for donations this month, as outlined on the back of the meeting's agenda. One new organization was the Marple Newtown High School LINK, a program offering students the opportunity to build self-esteem and leadership skills. George Boyajian made a motion to donate the funds as outlined in the agenda. The organizations and the amounts to be donated in parentheses are (1) Fisher House Foundation, Rockville, MD (\$2,000.00); (2) Marple Newtown High School LINK (\$500.00); (3) Operation First Response, Culpeper, VA (\$2,000.00); (4) Surrey Services for Seniors, Broomall, PA (\$1,000.00); (5) The Upper Darby Detachment MCL Ladies Auxiliary, Upper Darby, PA (\$1,000.00); (6) USA Together, Los Altos, CA (\$1,000.00); and (7) The USO, Philadelphia International Airport, Philadelphia, PA (\$2,000.00). Bernie McGinley seconded the motion and the motion passed. Earle Drake made a motion to donate \$1,000.00 to each of the three states affected by recent tornadoes in the south. Although the motion was not immediately seconded, discussion followed and it was decided to table this motion for discussion at the next officers' staff meeting.

George Boyajian made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Bill Kinney seconded the motion and the motion passed. After the normal closing ceremonies, the meeting was adjourned at 2050.

Bill Kinney won the 50/50. Forty members signed the logbook.
