

Waterhouse is famous for his painstakingly-researched and beautifully-rendered paintings which span our history from Revolutionary times to present.

The Legend Continues.....

In February 1903, a typical Central American revolution had broken out in Honduras. With an ill-assorted relief squadron consisting of the Flagship Olympia, a gunboat and an old banana freighter, Panther, used as a troop transport, Butler and his detachment spent ten blazing hot days enroute. There were no troop transport ships, as we know them today, and the mode of water troop travel was varied; freighter, colliers, barge, warship, etc.

Butler's detachment arrived at the principal port of Puerto Cortez. The "Revolution" had all the aspects of a "Gilbert and Sullivan" war and sole role was to standby. Next stop was Ceiba, Honduras. The conflict, between two Generals was settled by the Revolutionary soldiers killing the oppositions General. Since no American interests were threatened in Ceiba, Butler's detachment moved along the coasts to Trujillo. They arrived there just in time to save the American Consul, who was caught in the crossfire of the two warring factions. The "scrap" lasted several days with the Marines again, standing by. The bullets from the firefight were coming so close that the Marines had to move a little distance out in the bay. The outcome was the same here as in the other towns. The local forces went revolutionary. So long as Americans and their interest were not jeopardized, the job of the Marines in Honduras was finished.

Again, Butler was sent back to the Philadelphia Navy Yard for six months of garrison duty.

The Hello Girls

Women switchboard soldiers brought American efficiency to the French front during WWI.

General John Pershing had a problem. When American entered World War I in 1917, a jury-rigged battlefield telephone system was the primary means of getting orders to the troops on the front lines in France. But the French operators were hopelessly inefficient and spoke little English. The solution? Recruit women telephone operators from the United States who were fluent in both languages. The hitch? Apart from nursing, American women had never served in an official capacity. Nonetheless, Pershing had no shortage of recruits. His call for "switchboard soldiers" was answered by more than 7,000 women, of whom 233 were selected to serve overseas. They were known, affectionately, as "Hello Girls".

The Hello Girls relayed messages about troop movements and supplies – often in code – acted as interpreters between American and French units. A group of operators working near the front during the Meuse-Argonne Offensive, the final Allies push of the war, initially refused to leave their positions at the switchboards after the barracks caught fire, and went back to work as soon as the flames were extinguished. Several Hello Girls received citations for meritorious conduct and Chief Operator Grace Banker was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal.

Still, none of the Hello Girls qualified for veteran status when they returned home. Although they had been sworn into the service of the U.S. Signal Corps, wore mandatory army-issued uniforms and were subject to the rules of military discipline, they were considered civilian contract employees, not military personnel.

Their complaint to the government was "We signed no contracts and we served in a war zone under military orders...and had been constantly reminded of our duties as "Army women". Fewer than 20 Hello Girls were still alive in 1979 when Congress tacked an amendment onto the GI Bill improvement act that granted them honorable discharge, veterans' benefits and World War I victory medals.

General Meeting Minutes
3 November 2008

Commandant: Commandant Earle Drake opened the meeting at 1930, and the normal opening ceremonies were conducted. Officers present were Commandant Earle Drake, Sr. Vice Jim Robinson, Jr. Vice Jack McLeod, Adjutant Jack Kelly, Paymaster Bob Spano, Chaplain Chris Bush, Sergeant-at-Arms Jim Ross, Service Officer Connie McGinley, Director Paul Donohue, Director Paul Ferguson, Director Bernie McGinley, and Jr. Past Commandant Jerry Leon.

Minutes: George Boyajian made a motion to accept the minutes of the 6 October 2008 meeting as published in the *Scuttlebutt*. John Burfete seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

Officer Reports:

Commandant: Earle Drake mentioned that our member Lou DiSantis had passed away. He had also been a member of the American Legion and the VFW. Lou DiSantis had been a member of the Detachment's Honor Guard and he also was active in fund raising activities. Earle Drake mentioned again that Sandi Mauer is retiring as editor of the newsletter, the *Scuttlebutt*. She has won many awards in the past for her magnificent work, and she will be missed. Earle Drake expressed his appreciation for her work over the years. Earle Drake also commented on the upcoming Marine Corps Birthday Ball, and Detachment activities scheduled for Veterans Day on 11 November. It was mentioned that after charges were heard against Mr. James Alleva, the Department of Pennsylvania, MCL, has found the evidence presented sufficient to warrant Mr. Alleva's dismissal as a member of the Marine Corps League. Earle Drake also encouraged members to vote on Election Day, 4 November 2008.

Sr. Vice: Jim Robinson indicated that 91 individuals have signed up to attend the Marine Corps Birthday Ball at Paxon Hollow Golf Club. This is scheduled for 7 November 2008. Brigadier General Joseph J. McMenamin, USMC, (retired) will be the main speaker.

Jr. Vice: Jack McLeod reported on the completion of the Birthday Ball program book. He also reported on the success of the weekly fund raising activities. It was also mentioned that tickets are still available to buy or sell for the cash prizes that will be drawn at the December meeting.

Paymaster: Bob Spano presented the Paymaster's report as of the end of October 2008. Paul Donohue made a motion to accept the Paymaster's report as received. George Boyajian seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

Chaplain: Chris Bush commented on the passing of

Lou DiSantis. He also mentioned that John Haynal had recently undergone open-heart surgery. Get well cards were circulated during the meeting to be signed by members to be mailed to John Haynal as well as for Tom Kerrigan.

Adjutant: Jack Kelly mentioned that a cash gift of \$200.00 had been received in memory of Cpl. William J. DeFranco. He also read letters of thanks for Detachment donations from the American Red Cross and from Sandra Krauthem, President of the Upper Darby Marine Corps League Auxiliary. A letter signed by Barry Reese and Harry Finerfrock, of the VFW, regarding the passing of Lou DiSantis was also read. A card of thanks was also read that was received from Sandi Mauer, thanking the Detachment members for the honorarium that was given to her in recognition of her years of work as editor of the newsletter.

Committee Reports:

Adopt-a-Highway: John Burfete mentioned that the last Adopt-a-Highway event for the year was conducted on 19 October. He expressed his appreciation to those who participated and assisted him in the Adopt-a-Highway program this year.

Awards: Harry Kaufman reminded committee heads to submit the names of members to him for those members who should be recognized for their participation in Detachment events this year. There will be efforts made to consolidate activities on the recognition certificates so that proper recognition is made for each member. In doing so, the number of certificates received by each member is reduced to a minimum.

Color Guard: Joe Conigliaro mentioned that there was good participation by Detachment members at the recent Beirut Memorial event. He also mentioned that the Color Guard would be needed at the upcoming Marine Sunday event scheduled for 9 November 2008.

Flag Collection: Barry Reese reported that a large number of worn flags has been collected, and that a truck or van is needed to transport the worn flags to a location where they can be destroyed.

Historian: Bob Cosgrove reported that he has returned from his summer vacation, and he expressed his appreciation to John Cook for handling the Historian's duties while he was away.

Honor Guard: Wayne Barner reported that the Honor Guard has serviced 216 military funerals so far this year, including 28 during the month of October.

Toys for Tots: Dan Luty reported that supplies for this year have been picked up, and he indicated that additional help would be appreciated this year. Bob Spano will be coordinating certain activities this year

with placing boxes at the various locations, and in arranging the picking up of toys at the designated locations.

Officer Nominations: This was the second month of nominations for officer positions for 2009. Bob Cosgrove was nominated for Sr. Vice Commandant and Dan Luty was nominated for Judge Advocate. Both individuals accepted these nominations. In October, in the first month of nominations, the following nominations were made:

Members can submit names of members who they believe should be considered for this award and the members of the committee will arrive at a final list of three nominees. The members will vote for their choice among the three nominees to determine the individual who will receive the Marine of the Year award. Voting will take place at the December General Meeting and the award will be presented at the January 2009 General Meeting.

New Business: John Burfete indicated that the small flags at the entrance to this facility are worn and need to be replaced. Bob Spano indicated that he would look into this situation.

Good of the League: Bob Spano made a motion to donate \$1,000.00 to each of the following organizations: The Coatesville VA Medical Center, Toys for Tots, The Philadelphia VA Medical Center, Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors (TAPS), The USO, and The Salvation Army. All of these programs had been previously reviewed, and had been found to be sound organizations. The Detachment has donated funds to all of these organizations in the past. George Boyajian seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Bernie McGinley made a suggestion to consider another organization, Hope for the Warriors. It was indicated that 88% of their expenses are spent on

program services. This organization will be considered at the next Staff Meeting.

Barry Reese reported that a new veteran's book recognizing certain veterans in Delaware County would be coming out shortly. He also reported on a classic car show that is to be held at Rose Tree Park on 9 November, and several veterans' organizations will be participating in this show.

Announcements: It was announced that Deb Luty will be the new editor of the *Scuttlebutt*.

George Boyajian made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Tony Fusto seconded the motion. After the normal closing ceremonies, the meeting was adjourned at 2045. Fifty members signed the logbook.
