# 'Ourselves, Alone'

From the time of our landing at Inchon in September, 1950, until the ending of the Uisong guerrilla patrols in the following January, the war was a series of continuous short and bloody skirmishes, one after another.

February 1951 brought a new phase to the war in Korea when the 1st Division was again reassembled and used as one complete unit. Towns on maps were just names. That year we never were in any town or village. We were in the hills, valleys and mountains all the time.

We never slept or were quartered in any structured buildings. Cleanliness was unknown! Whatever was in our backpacks were our only possessions. Time, days, dates, months were unimportant, since we could see no end of the war in sight and had no idea how the war was going except in our little group. That state of affairs instilled the camaraderie in C- 1-1 that still exists today.

It was, as the lawyer, soldier, and poet Albert Pike said, "OURSELVES, ALONE."

"What we have done for ourselves alone dies with us;

What we have done for others and the world, remains and is immortal."

**General Meeting Minutes – 3 December 2013**

Commandant: Commandant Jim Herbst opened the meeting at 1800 and the regular opening ceremonies were conducted. This was the Detachment's annual Christmas dinner meeting, with dinner scheduled to follow the meeting. Officers present were Commandant Jim Herbst, Sr. Vice Commandant Paul Ferguson, Jr. Vice Commandant Jack McLeod, Paymaster Bob Spano, Adjutant Jack Kelly, Chaplain Chris Bush, Sergeant-at-Arms Charles (Bud) Davis, Service Officer Con McGinley, Director Roger Godfrey, and Director Bill Kinney. Guests for the meeting included Gunnery Sergeant Jesus Melendrez, Jim Burns, American Legion Eighth District Adjutant, and his son, Pfc. Steven Burns, USMC, headed to Camp Geiger at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina.

Minutes: George Boyajian made a motion to accept the minutes of the 4 November 2013 general meeting as published in the *Scuttlebutt*. Jim Donegan seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Officer Reports:

Commandant: Jim Herbst expressed his thanks to Paul Ferguson for organizing the annual Birthday Ball, which was very successful. There was a round of applause for Paul Ferguson from the membership. Jim Herbst also expressed his appreciation to the members who had assisted in the various ceremonial events on Veterans Day. Jim Herbst mentioned that the next staff meeting would be at 1800 on 26 December 2013 at Valentino's Restaurant in Broomall, PA. The January general meeting would be for the installation of officers and the annual awards night meeting.

Sr. Vice Commandant: Paul Ferguson expressed his appreciation by name to all those individuals who had assisted him with the annual USMC Birthday ball.

Adjutant: Jack Kelly mentioned that a number of letters of thanks for donations made by the Detachment had been received. Letters were received from the Fisher House Foundation, Operation First Response, the Semper Fi Fund, and from the St. Vincent DePaul Society. Another letter was received from Guy Fizzano, DCVMA Board President, directed to the Combined Veterans Alliance, thanking those members who had participated in the Veterans Day Ceremony at the Delaware County Veterans Memorial on Veterans Day.

Jr. Vice Commandant: Jack McLeod provided a report on the year's Help Us Help Others (HUHO) Campaign. The last event was held in mid-November, and this year seventy-six events were held, over Saturdays and Sundays, plus three events at certain holidays. There were thirty-seven participants at twenty-two host locations, and more than \$132,000.00 was raised this year. Jack McLeod was thankful to the host stores, areas shoppers, and to Almighty God who blessed the Detachment's endeavor with good weather. Jack McLeod also mentioned that the program book for the annual Birthday Ball had seen about \$4,000.00 collected from advertisements so far, with some still to come. The program book and the sale of the tickets for the Ball should indicate that the Ball would be either a break even event, or more likely, a profitable event for the Detachment.

Paymaster: Bob Spano reviewed the paymaster's report as of 30 November 2013. Much of the activity for the month revolved around income and expenses of the annual Birthday Ball. Bob Spano also suggested that the membership review the list of organizations to be considered for donations later on in the meeting. George Boyajian made a motion to accept the paymaster's report as received. Jim Donegan seconded the motion. There was one question from Bill Kinney concerning one entry under the budget portion of the report, but this was addressed by Bob Spano, indicating that the minus sign in that one entry was a program error. The motion passed and the report was accepted. Jim Herbst also indicated that on the back page there was a listing of upcoming Department and National meetings or conventions, for those interested.

Service Officer: Con McGinley mentioned that the Coatesville VA Medical Center would be having a Christmas party on 14 December 2013.

Director Kinney: Bill Kinney mentioned that the Delaware County Veterans Memorial has had bricks available for sale in the 8"x8" size for \$100.00. The Memorial now has a new size of brick available in a 12"x12" size for \$200.00. This information is not yet available on the Memorial's website, but it is something that will be added. Bill Kinney also commented on the Wreaths Across America event, which is scheduled for 14 December 2013. All information is not known at this time, but further information will be provided as the date nears. It is possible that the Color Guard and the Rifle Squad may be involved in the Wreaths Across America event.

Committee Reports:

Public Relations: John Burfete mentioned that he has been busy, forwarding e-mails from various sources to the membership on a variety of topics. He has also been forwarding items for publication to the local media on Detachment activities.

Americanism/General Information: Earle Drake mentioned that he, Jim Mulhern, and Lloyd Spangler had made Americanism presentations at the St. Patrick's School, the Cardinal Foley School, and the St. Pius School. Earle Drake reported that Bernie McGinley, Lloyd Spangler and Joe Conigliaro had made an Americanism presentation at the St. Anastasia School on 5 November 2013. In other notes of interest, Earle Drake mentioned that he and Jim Mulhern represented the Detachment at a Veterans Mass at West Catholic High School, where Jim Mulhern is on the Board of Trustees. Earle Drake also reported that Jim McGuigan, a Past Commandant of the Detachment and Earle Drake had represented the Detachment at Highgate at Paoli Pointe, an assisted living community in Paoli. They presented Certificates of Appreciation to those residents who had served in World War II. Earle Drake provided information on the staff dinner at Valentino's in Broomall scheduled for 26 December 2013. He also mentioned the Veterans Walk at the VA Community Living Center in Philadelphia on 23 December 2013. Looking ahead, he mentioned that there would be a program in February at Neumann University honoring the Montford Point Marines. In addition, the Detachment will be placing a Flag Day exhibit in the Springfield Public Library in June, 2014.

Awards: Jim Herbst mentioned that Harry Kaufman has decided to step down from this area of responsibility, so Jim Herbst asked Committee Chairmen to forward the names of members to be recognized to him or to Bob Spano.

Certificates will be prepared to recognize those members who were active in Detachment activities during the year. Names of members to be recognized should be sent to Jim Herbst by the following week.

Color Guard: Jim Donegan expressed his appreciation to those members of the Color Guard who had participated in the Veterans Day activities at the Delaware County Veterans Memorial and the other events on Veterans Day. Jim Donegan mentioned two events were coming up where the Color Guard would be needed, including the Wreaths Across America event on 14 December 2013 and then the annual Christmas Party for the National Realty Corporation of the DeBotton family on 20 December 2013. Toys for the Toys for Tots program will be collected at this event also.

Flag Collection: Barry Reese mentioned that there would be a burning of old flags sometime after the first of the year. He also expressed his appreciation to Dominic D'Allessandro who has been assisting him.

Honor Guard: Ben Sides reported that there had been eleven funerals for deceased military veterans during November. There have been 175 military funerals for veterans served by the Honor Guard so far during 2013. Ben Sides also mentioned that someone from the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) would be inspecting the condition of the rifles and to see if any parts are needed.

Membership: Jim Herbst again mentioned the need to recruit new members. The Detachment has approximately 150 members, but more members are always needed.

Toys for Tots: Bob Cosgrove provided a report on this year's Toys for Tots activity. Collection boxes for toys are out at about 100 sites and based on early activity, it should be a very successful year. The toys that are collected will be deposited at Videon Chrysler-Dodge-Jeep on West Chester Pike in Edgmont Township, PA. From there, they will be transferred to the Marine Corps Reserve Training Center in Folsom, PA. Bob Cosgrove mentioned the annual Carpenters' Union meeting on 18 December 2013 in which toys will be dropped off, and Bob Cosgrove asked for some members to be present for that. A check for \$2,000.00 for the Toys for Tots Program was presented to Gunnery Sergeant Jesus Melendrez of the Folsom Marine Training Center by Jim Herbst and Bob Cosgrove. Gunnery Sergeant Jesus Melendrez expressed his thanks to the members of the Detachment.

Unfinished Business: Jim Herbst introduced Jack Kelly to conduct the election process for the Detachment's Marine of the Year Award for 2013. Three nominees were presented to the membership, and they were Jim Herbst, Paul Ferguson, and Ben Sides. A secret ballot was taken, and at the end of the process there was a tie for the Award. The two nominees with the most votes were Paul Ferguson and Ben Sides. Since the vote ended in a tie, another vote was taken between just those two members, and a recipient of the Award was elected. The recipient of the Marine of the Year Award will be announced at the January general meeting.

Nomination of Officers for 2014: Since Jr. Past Commandant Dan Luty was not present, Commandant Jim Herbst called on Past Commandant Earle Drake to conduct the final round of

nomination of officers for 2014. Nominations for the following positions have been accepted by:

As there were no contested positions with two or more members nominated, Commandant Jim Herbst requested that Adjutant Jack Kelly cast one vote for each person nominated, and for the three Directors nominated, as called for in the Detachment's By-laws and Administrative Procedures. This was done and the slate of officers was elected for the 2014 year. Jack Kelly asked that the membership confirm the election with a round of applause for the officers for 2014, and this was accomplished.

New Business: Bob Spano reviewed the suggested list of organizations to be considered for donations this month. Bernie McGinley made a motion to donate the funds to the organizations listed. George Boyajian seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Announcements: Bob Spano mentioned that a car was parked in a no parking zone and he indicated that the vehicle should be moved. Wes Tomlinson mentioned that there would be an open house at the Pennsylvania Veterans Museum in Media, PA on 7 December 2013.

Good of the League: Jim Herbst mentioned that if anyone had anything to contribute to the newsletter, the *Scuttlebutt*, it should be submitted to editor Dan Luty by the fifteenth of the month.

George Boyajian made a motion to adjourn the meeting, and the motion was seconded by Jim Donegan. The motion passed. After the normal closing ceremonies, the meeting was adjourned at 1900. The membership then joined the Auxiliary for the annual Christmas dinner.

Tom Kerrigan won the 50/50. Thirty-seven members signed the logbook.

***Find out what the motto “Semper Fidelis” really means by asking Sgt. Ronald Coonley or reading the letter from a grateful son-in-law who witnessed a Marine deliver a final salute to his father-in-law, a WWII veteran.***



What is a United States Marine? That is something that cannot easily be defined. Much depends on which side of right you are on. To the Germans in WWI they were known as Devil Dogs, to the hundreds of thousands that they have given aid they are angels. This time of the year we often think of them as Santa’s helpers with the work they do with “Toys for Tots”.

In this case it is about a Marine Corps Sergeant Ronald Coonley who not only knows the Marine Corps Motto, “Semper Fidelis” or in Marine Corps jargon shortened to “Semper Fi”. For the unschooled in Latin it means “Always Faithful” or “Always Loyal”. It is a brotherhood that can always be counted on.

Never was that more in evidence than when Sergeant Coonley responded to the request from a chaplain from Baptist South Hospice that approached him to present a certificate of Marine Corps Service to my father-in-law James H. Legg during his final days. Sergeant Coonley’s professionalism and demeanor during this solemn occasion was in keeping with the highest tradition of the United States Marine Corps.

James H. Legg joined the US Marines in 1941 following the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. He became part of the 1st Marine Division and participated in the landings at Guadalcanal, Pelileu, and Iwo Jima. He also was in the first wave to land in Japan following the use of the atomic bomb on Nagasaki. His job during these landings was that of a driver of an LTV (Landing Tracked Vehicle).

Although leaving the Marine Corps at the conclusion of the hostilities of WWII, he lived by the motto, “Once a Marine, Always a Marine.” He became an active member of his local Marine Corps League in Ilion, New York and lived his life by the same traits that were instilled from day one in the Corps.

Until Sergeant Coonley’s arrival at my home, my father-in-law had not opened his eyes for days, or responded in any way. That all changed when Sergeant Coonley spoke to him. He awoke and became alert and I believe he fully understood the changing of the guard from one Marine to another. Following that salute given by Sergeant Coonley and depicted in this photograph, my father-in-law slipped into a coma and peacefully succumbed a few days later.

If the Army and the Navy ever look on heaven’s scene,  
They will find the streets are guarded by (Another) United States Marine
