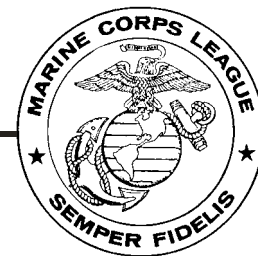

The Legend Continues ...

In the spring of 1914 an international incident reached crisis proportions when U.S. President Woodrow Wilson, seeking to provoke the removal of Mexican Dictator Victoriano Huerta, ordered the occupation of Mexico's principal port city, Vera Cruz, by American Armed Forces.

In the years since Mexico achieved independence from Spain in 1821, its history had been characterized by war, foreign domination and a succession of dictatorships and internal conflicts.

Revolution had raged in Mexico since 1910 and Mexican Dictator, Victoriano Huerta, had seized power by the murdering of the previous ruler, President Francisco Madero.

More than 40,000 Americans lived in Mexico in 1914 and the U.S. had investments exceeding one billion dollars. Americans owned more than half of Mexico's oil fields and mines plus extensive railroad systems.

All this was a safe but fragile peace that was near breaking point!

Smedley Butler had left Panama and was now serving with the fleet aboard the battleship, U.S.S. Minnesota.

The fleet was under the command of Admiral Frank Fletcher and he assigned Butler to the task of going ashore to Tampico, Mexico and via disguise, he was to map a military plan to commandeer the railroad and rescue the Americans in Mexico City in case the Mexicans rose up against them. He also was to note the strength of the fortifications along the proposed route. While barely evading capture as a spy on several occasions, he safely completed his mission and reported back to Admiral Fletcher.

General Meeting Minutes - May 4, 2009

Commandant: Earle Drake opened the meeting at 1930. The normal opening ceremonies were conducted. Officers present were Commandant Earle Drake, Sr. Vice Bob Cosgrove, Jr. Vice Jack McLeod, Judge Advocate Dan Luty, Adjutant Jack Kelly, Paymaster Bob Spano, Chaplain Chris Bush, Sergeant-at-Arms Jim Ross, Director Jim Herbst, Director Bernie McGinley, and Junior Past Commandant Jerry Leon.

Remembrance Ceremony: As has been the Detachment's custom, the Detachment recognized those who had passed away in the past year. Those recognized were Frank McNulty, Louis DiSantis, Anthony Nastri, Thomas Flack, Al Brennecke, and Bill Charlton. Auxiliary members who passed away were Debra Kerber and Dorothy Flack. Also recognized was Wade Phillips, a member of the Marple Newtown Combined Veterans Alliance, who had recently passed away.

New Members: Two potential new members were introduced to the Detachment membership. After introductions, both were accepted into membership. Edward Seidl, a former captain in the Marine Corps, was accepted as a regular member of the Detachment. John Meyer, who served three years in the Army, was accepted as an associate member. Both were sworn in by Commandant Earle Drake.

Minutes: Joe Hudson made a motion to accept the minutes of the 6 April 2009 general meeting as published in the *Scuttlebutt*. Jerry Leon seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

Officer Reports:

Commandant's Report: On 3 May 2009, the Detachment had hosted the Southeast District meeting. The Detachment was well represented and Earle Drake noted his appreciation for all those who participated. Earle Drake also expressed his appreciation to the Auxiliary for their contributions to the meeting.

Adjutant: Jack Kelly mentioned that a letter of thanks was received from the St. Vincent DePaul Society, expressing appreciation for the donation received from the Detachment. A note of thanks was received from Sandra Krautheim, President of the Upper Darby Marine Corps League Auxiliary, thanking our Detachment for the donation received to assist them in the mailing of packages to the service men and women overseas.

Sr. Vice: Bob Cosgrove reported on the Southeast District meeting of the day before, and invited Detachment members to partake of some of the food that was left over from that meeting.

Bob also mentioned that the June meeting would be the annual scholarship awards dinner meeting. A sign-up sheet was circulated during the meeting to determine the number of people planning to attend. The cost of the dinner is \$12.00 per person, and the meeting is scheduled for 1 June 2009, beginning at 1800.

Chaplain: Chris Bush reported that Bill Charlton had recently passed away. He also mentioned that Phil Baglivo is at Devon Manor in a physical rehabilitation program.

Jr. Vice: Jack McLeod provided information on the "Help Our Heroes" campaign. Members have been asked to contact friends, relatives or acquaintances in order to seek contributions for the Detachment. So far, more than forty contributions have been received. Jack McLeod also provided information on the "Help Us Help Others" campaign, in which the Detachment members request donations from shoppers at area supermarkets. The first two dates at area stores have been successful.

Paymaster: Bob Spano provided the Paymaster's report as of 30 April 2009. George Boyajian made a motion to accept the Paymaster's report for the month of April as received. Bernie McGinley seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Director Bernie McGinley: Although he indicated that he did not have a report, he did indicate that more members are needed to assist with the "Help Us Help Others" campaign, and he encouraged members to become involved in this endeavor.

Committee Reports:

Adopt-a-Highway: Although John Burfete was not in attendance, Earle Drake commented that there had been a good turnout for the first Adopt-a-Highway event in April. Twelve bags of trash were collected on Bishop Hollow Road in Marple Township.

Color Guard: Joe Conigliaro reported on the Color Guard's activity at the Southeast District meeting, along with buglers Lloyd Spangler and Dan Fitzpatrick. Joe Conigliaro mentioned that upcoming events include participation in ceremonies at Lima Estates and Dunwoody Village on 22 May 2009, as well as Memorial Day activities on 25 May 2009. Participation in the annual National Day of Prayer at Rose Tree Park on 7 May 2009 has not been confirmed as yet, but Earle Drake will look into this to determine if a Detachment Color Guard is needed.

Flag Collection: Dennis Morsa reported on the large number of flags that have been collected that are no longer serviceable. The upcoming flag retirement ceremony is scheduled for 16 May 2009 along with the Upper Darby Detachment. Dennis Morsa asked for assistance from the members for this important flag retirement ceremony.

Honor Guard: John Cook indicated that 75 funerals had been serviced so far this year. He mentioned that the funeral for Wade Phillips, an American Legion member, would be the following day, 5 May 2009.

Marksmanship: Gene Kern reported on the Detachment's participation in the Department's pistol match scheduled for 29, 30, and 31 May 2009 at Indiantown Gap, PA. Newtown Township Veterans Park: Earle Drake reported that the Detachment had an information table set up recently at Harrah's in Chester, PA. A mock-up of the memorial was shown and people were encouraged to purchase a brick to assist in providing funds for the memorial. Earle Drake also mentioned that Jerry Leon would be assuming new responsibilities on this committee to assist with fundraising and other activities.

Scholarships: Wayne Williams reported that scholarship applications had been received from ten individuals, and the Detachment is also providing a scholarship for a midshipman at Villanova University's NROTC unit. Wayne Williams made a motion to provide \$500.00 scholarships to all ten applicants, plus the one at Villanova University. The motion was seconded by Dan Luty, and the motion passed. Those receiving scholarships are Ashley Brown, Dana Baiocco, Owen Kinney, Ashley Ross, Julia Cutting, Amanda Andrews, LeAnn McGinley, Alexa Bunce, Stephanie Bunce, Amanda Phillip, and John Steele, Villanova NROTC, with Marine Corps option.

Scouting: Jack Gingras provided information on Eagle Scout presentations. There have been four so far this year, and two more are scheduled this week, and more activity is planned for the month of June.

Unfinished Business:

Earle Drake presented awards for Adopt-a-Highway participation during 2008 to Paul Drinkard and Frank Greiser.

New Business: George Boyajian suggested that pictures and other information be submitted to *Semper Fi* magazine, in order to publicize Detachment activities. Bob Cosgrove, Detachment Historian, will submit some items to the magazine.

Bob Spano made a motion to donate \$1,000.00 to operation First Response, specifically for Mike Hudson from Bensalem, PA, who had been injured in Afghanistan. (The funds are to be distributed as needed, not all at once.) Bernie McGinley seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

Bob Spano made another motion to donate \$1,000.00 to Scotland School, a school for children of veterans. Dan Luty seconded the motion. A question was raised concerning the future of the school, since government funding may be reduced or eliminated. It was indicated that if the school does close, financial aid would still be available to the students. After discussion, the motion passed. Bob Spano made another motion to donate \$1,000.00 to Surrey for Seniors, a local organization that provides transportation for senior citizens. Jerry Leon seconded the motion, and the motion passed. All three of these motions had been discussed at the recent staff meeting of officers and recommended by the officers for consideration by the membership.

Good of the League:

Dennis Morsa mentioned the placing of flags on the graves of veterans at Glenwood Cemetery, scheduled for 23 May 2009. Volunteers are needed to assist in this event.

Dan Luty reported on the recent March of Dimes walk in Ridley Creek State Park. Joe Deriso, Bob Spano, and Dan Luty participated in the walk, and others were there offering financial and moral support.

George Boyajian made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Bernie McGinley seconded the motion. After the normal closing ceremonies, the meeting was adjourned at 2040.

George Curran won the 50/50. Thirty-seven members signed the logbook.
