**General Meeting Minutes – 7 April 2015**

**Commandant:** Commandant Paul Ferguson called the meeting to order at 1930 and the regular opening ceremonies were conducted. Officers present were Commandant Paul Ferguson, Sr. Vice Commandant Dominic D'Alessandro, Jr. Vice Commandant Jack McLeod, Judge Advocate Bernie McGinley, Paymaster Bob Spano, Adjutant Jack Kelly, Chaplain Chris Bush, Sergeant-at-Arms Charles (Bud) Davis, Service Officer Con McGinley, Director Paul Donohue, Director Bill Kinney, and Jr. Past Commandant Jim Herbst.

**Minutes:** George Boyajian made a motion to accept the minutes of the 3 March 2015 general meeting as published in the *Scuttlebutt*. Ben Sides seconded the motion and the motion passed.

**Officer Reports:**

**Commandant:** Paul Ferguson reviewed several upcoming events. He mentioned that the funeral for the father of Larry Snyder, Commander of American Legion Post #805, would be held on Wednesday, 8 April 2015. He encouraged the membership to attend. Paul Ferguson mentioned that an Italian Night dinner is scheduled for 17 April 2015 at the Noonan-Slook American Legion Post in Havertown, PA. Rudy Schaffhauser provided some additional information, stating that all proceeds would go to the Walk for the Wounded organization. The cost of the dinner is \$15.00 and anyone interested could contact Rudy Schaffhauser. Paul Ferguson also mentioned that anyone who served in Desert Storm or Desert Shield has until the end of May to apply for a \$75.00 bonus for each month served. The Spring Review of the Villanova NROTC company is scheduled for 21 April 2015. It was also mentioned that several volunteers are needed for a Color Guard event at the Beverly Hills Middle School in Upper Darby on 22 May 2015. Earle Drake provided some additional information on this event.

**Adjutant:** Jack Kelly reported that letters of thanks for donations made by the Detachment had been received from the Society of St. Vincent DePaul in Havertown, PA, from the Semper Fi Fund in Oceanside, CA, and from the Liberty USO at the Philadelphia International Airport. Two notes of thanks were received for honors bestowed at two recent military funerals. The family of Jim McGuigan, a former Detachment Commandant, sent a note thanking the Detachment for everyone who came to the funeral. In addition, John Burfete sent a note in which he expressed his appreciation for the Honor Guard that served at the funeral of his cousin, Robert E. McKenna, a Korean War veteran. Jack Kelly mentioned the Villanova NROTC Spring Review is scheduled for 21 April 2015, with a reception at 1400 and the ceremony at 1500. Eight members have indicated they would attend. The Chester County Detachment is having a roast of its Marine of the Year. The event is scheduled for 9 May 2015, and the cost is \$15.00 per person. George Boyajian mentioned that he had received a letter of thanks for a donation made by the Detachment from Operation HomeFront.

**Jr. Vice Commandant:** Jack McLeod mentioned that three events had been conducted so far in the Help Us Help Others campaign, with a total of \$10,700.00 collected in the three events. There was no collection activity on Easter Sunday, and Jack McLeod mentioned that possibly next year he would consider scheduling Friday and Saturday of Easter weekend instead of Saturday and Sunday.

**Service Officer:** Con McGinley mentioned that there is a bingo game scheduled for this Thursday at the Coatesville Medical Center.

**Director Kinney:** Bill Kinney mentioned that there is a meeting scheduled for the next day for the Delaware County Veterans Memorial Committee. The topic of flag raising at the Memorial would be one of the topics discussed at the meeting. Bill Kinney also mentioned that the Detachment will be involved in a brief ceremony at the Memorial on Memorial Day. Other events will also be scheduled for Memorial Day for the Detachment's participation. Bill Kinney also mentioned that the Delaware County Veterans Memorial Committee will be holding another dinner in November in recognition of Veterans Day.

**Jr. Past Commandant:** Jim Herbst mentioned that it is early, but he reminded the membership that in October, it will again be time again for the nomination of officers for the Detachment. He mentioned that anyone seeking office for any of the officer positions should let Jim Herbst know, or contact any present officer. All officer positions are open for nomination, and any regular members are encouraged to run for office, if certain eligibility requirements are met. Jim Herbst also distributed Meritorious Commendations or Certificates of Appreciation for activity during 2014 to George Boyajian (fundraising), John Burfete (fundraising, Adopt-a-Highway), Dominick Mattioni (fundraising), Tom McGovern (Honor Guard), and Nick Repino (Toys for Tots).

**Sr. Vice Commandant:** Dominic D'Alessandro mentioned that the spring dinner meeting is scheduled for 2 June 2015. This is the annual scholarship awards dinner. The cost of the dinner is \$13.00 per person. The dinner will be at 1800 and the meeting will follow after the dinner. Dominic D'Alessandro also mentioned that an MCL Detachment from Utah had inquired about the possibility of attending our Detachment's Birthday Ball in November 2016. This Utah Detachment would be in the Philadelphia area for a reunion in November 2016, and would like to attend our Birthday Ball. This had been discussed at the recent officers' staff meeting, and no discussion followed at this meeting. Dominic D'Alessandro has scheduled the 2016 Birthday Ball for Saturday, 12 November 2016 at the Paxon Hollow Country Club.

**Paymaster:** Bob Spano presented the paymaster's report as of 31 March 2015. He also suggested that the membership should review the list of organizations on the back of the agenda. These organizations will be considered for donations later in the meeting. Bob Spano provided some background information on one organization, Building for America's Bravest, which is a new organization to be considered for donations. George Boyajian made a motion to accept the paymaster's report as received. Bill Kinney seconded the motion and the motion passed.

**Committee Reports:**

**Adopt-a-Highway:** John Burfete mentioned that the first Adopt-a-Highway event of the year would be held on Sunday, 12 April 2015, beginning at 0830. He outlined the normal activities, and he asked for volunteers. He stated that he would be sending out a reminder e-mail message this week to the entire membership about this program.

**Americanism:** Earle Drake reported that the Americanism team of Jim Mulhern, Lloyd Spangler and Earle Drake would be making three three Americanism presentations in the coming months. He also outlined the schedule for the Banana Wars exhibits, including at the Delaware County Historical Society Museum until the end of May, when it will be switched to the Springfield Library in June. Later it will be on display at the Newtown Square Historical Preservation Society for four Saturdays in August. Earle Drake also reviewed plans for an upcoming postal match to be held at Delaware County Field and Stream on 26 April 2015. He explained the process of the match and indicated that each shooter would be firing 60 rounds through the designated streams of fire.

Earle Drake also mentioned that the family of the late Jim McGuigan would be going ahead with plans for his 90th birthday party, even though Jim McGuigan passed away in February. The event is scheduled for 18 April 2015 at the Marple Presbyterian Church. Earle Drake also provided information on the upcoming District One MCL meeting, scheduled for 12 April 2015, to be held at the Upper Darby MCL home.

Color Guard: Paul Ferguson mentioned that Jim Donegan has resigned as chairman of the Color Guard, and Paul asked for a volunteer to fill this post. No one volunteered right away, so Paul Ferguson asked for anyone interested in being the Color Guard chairman to see him after the meeting.

Honor Guard: Ben Sides reported that there were fifteen military funerals during March, and there had already been five more so far in April. Ben Sides also provided some information on the funeral for the father of Larry Snyder, American Legion Post #805 Commander. The funeral would be the next day, 8 April 2015. Ben Sides also mentioned that the Army reimbursement process that they had submitted paperwork for has been for naught, as the Army has changed its position on this. Ben Sides also mentioned that occasionally the Honor Guard receives money from funeral homes for their Honor Guard members, and these funds will be used to treat the Honor Guard members to lunch at some convenient time. This topic had also been discussed at a recent officers' staff meeting.

Marksmanship: Paul Drinkard provided information on the 2015 Pennsylvania MCL service match, scheduled for 29-31 May 2015. There will be two matches, one service match and one non-service match. A person can shoot one or the other, or both. There will be sixty rounds fired in each match. This will be conducted at Range 14 at Indiantown Gap, beginning at 0700 on Saturday.

Property: Bob Spano mentioned that he had received a request from Ben Sides to purchase some gloves for the Honor Guard.

Communications: John Burfete mentioned that he has been forwarding a number of e-mails that he has received from Liz McLeaster from the MCL Department of Pennsylvania. He has also sent out some press releases on the Banana Wars exhibits, as well as placing information in the Marple Newtown Patch.

Scholarships: Wayne Williams mentioned that the due date for applications for the Detachment scholarship program is 15 April 2015. The Department of Pennsylvania scholarship program has a due date is 31 May, and the MCL National scholarship program has a due date of 1 July 2015. Wayne Williams mentioned that he had received five applications so far for our Detachment scholarship program. He reminded everyone that the scholarships are chosen at the May general meeting and then awarded at the June general meeting. Bernie McGinley inquired if the Detachment has ever looked into the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation, since there have been positive reports about the amount of funds available through the Foundation. Wayne Williams indicated that he could look into the program.

Toys for Tots: Paul Ferguson mentioned that a chairman is needed for this year's Toys for Tots program. Anyone interested should contact Paul Ferguson.

Liberty USO: Paul Ferguson provided information on activity at the Liberty USO. He limited his observations to only the time that he is there on Fridays, but he indicated that the last several weeks have been extremely busy. The USO has recently replaced some recliners in the lounge and the number of troops coming through has the USO "swamped" at times. Paul and others have been feeding a large number of troops coming through the USO.

He also mentioned that they had helped three families in need around Christmas, and they were also able to provide some assistance to these families again at Easter with some toys and gift cards.

Old Business: No items of old business were raised.

New Business: John Burfete mentioned that he wanted to thank Ben Sides and the members of the Honor Guard for the ceremony provided for John's cousin. John Burfete's cousin's ashes were transported back to Pennsylvania from Florida and the Honor Guard provided the military honors. John Burfete's cousin, Robert E. McKenna, was a U.S. Army veteran of the Korean War.

Charitable Contributions: Bob Spano reviewed the list of organizations listed on the back of the agenda, which were being suggested for donations this month. These had been discussed at a recent officers' staff meeting and were being recommended to the membership for consideration. George Boyajian made a motion to donate the funds as outlined. The organizations and the amounts to be donated in parentheses are (1) Fisher House Foundation, Rockville, MD (\$2,000.00); (2) The Injured Marine Semper Fi Fund, Oceanside, CA (\$2,000.00); (3) Building For America's Bravest, Staten Island, NY (\$1,000.00); (4) Operation First Response, Culpeper, VA (\$2,000.00); and (5) The USO, Philadelphia International Airport, Philadelphia, PA (\$2,000.00). Bill Kinney seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Good of the League: Anthony (Tony) Evangelista, Commandant of the Tun Tavern Detachment, presented a plaque to Commandant Paul Ferguson in appreciation of the Detachment's support given to the Tun Tavern Detachment's Christmas Walk. The Tun Tavern Detachment supports the Community Living Center in West Philadelphia as well as the Snyder House, an organization that supports needy veterans.

The membership then sang "Happy Birthday" to Ollie McGraw, who would soon be celebrating his 94th birthday. A birthday cake was given to him.

George Boyajian made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Several members seconded the motion and the motion passed. After the regular closing ceremonies, the meeting was adjourned at 2025.

Jim Constien won the 50/50. Thirty-eight members signed the logbook.
