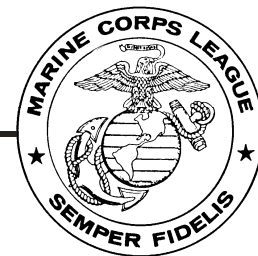

Drawing for Dollars, D4D

Our Fall/Winter Campaign launched on August 30 with Store Sales at Super Fresh Manoa, Pathmark Broomall and Gentile's Market with very satisfactory results. These events were followed by two equally successful weekends with fundraising activity taking place at two locations on each date. Asking for donations allows us to staff events at two locations without increasing our Members' workload over historical levels.

As mentioned last month, we have a supply of approximately 500 Ticket Chances, (part of an original order of 3000 tickets) that is unlikely to be sold during the remainder of our Campaign.

These tickets will be available for sale to Members at future Detachment Meetings or by phone order from me, 610-356-8893. There is a **minimum order of \$10 for 7 tickets and a maximum order of \$100 for 100 tickets.** Alternative purchases can be made at \$20 for 16 tickets, \$50 for 45 tickets or a prorated price for orders falling between these price-points. **If Member demand to purchase tickets or to sell tickets to others is high, we may order additional tickets to meet the demand.**

"GOOKS"

As a result of the Spanish-American War in 1898 the United States acquired the Philippine Islands. The rebels had been challenging the Spanish colonial regime and were fighting for their post-Spanish independence. The United States had assured them that the Americans were noncolonial by their very nature. In time, the United States ended up fighting in a cruel and ugly war of suppression. Again, two very powerful American instincts were evident—a missionary drive that demanded the United States assume colonial responsibility over the islands in order to civilize the natives as part of a Christian white man's burden, and at the same time racism of the most virulent kind, so that the guerrillas were called either "niggers" or "gugus" or ("goo'goos"). The latter name came from the bark of a tree that women used as they shampooed their hair. It was a term which eventually morphed into the all-purpose word for Asians, gooks, which the American troops used to identify Asians from WWII right through Korea and Viet Nam.

THE LEGEND CONTINUES

St. David's Day

On July 13, 1900, during the Boxer Rebellion, the U.S. Marine Corps, joined by the Royal Welsh Fusiliers, began their attack on the City of Peking, China to free some 200 foreigners who had taken refuge from the Chinese in the British legation.

In order to insure that Marine and Welsh Fusilier troops kept in close contact during the fighting without infiltration of enemy forces, a watchword, "And Saint David" was used.

On August 14, 1900, after heavy fighting, the expedition succeeded in relieving the besieged legation and occupied the City of Peking.

March 1st is St. David's Day and the national holiday of Wales. Every year since 1900, on this day the USMC Commandant and the Col. In charge of the Welsh Fusiliers, which is still an active unit, exchange the simple message "And Saint David", in memory of their joint expeditionary battle in China.

As a memento of the joint operation, the Fusiliers sent to the Marines two small Chinese cannons which are now located one at 8th and I Streets, Washington, D.C., and the other at the Marine Corps Museum in the Washington Navy Yard.

An interesting sidelight story, the Royal Welsh Fusiliers were not always friendly to the Americans. They fought against the Continental Army at Bunker Hill and Yorktown in the Revolutionary War.

General Meeting Minutes
3 September 2008

Commandant: Commandant Earle Drake opened the meeting at 1930, and the normal opening ceremonies were conducted. Officers present were Commandant Earle Drake, Sr. Vice Jim Robinson, Judge Advocate Dan Luty, Adjutant Jack Kelly, Paymaster Bob Spano, Chaplain Chris Bush, Sergeant-at-Arms Jim Ross, Service Officer Connie McGinley, Director Paul Ferguson, Director Bernie McGinley, and Past Commandant Jerry Leon. Jerry Leon served as Jr. Vice for the meeting in the absence of Jack McLeod. Bill Miller, Southeast Pennsylvania District Vice Commandant, was recognized as a guest at the meeting.

Prior to the Commandant's report, Evelyn Brimble, president of the Auxiliary, requested assistance from the Detachment's members in assisting in finding new members for the Auxiliary. She also requested assistance in supplying food items for the picnic to be held at the Coatesville Veterans Hospital the following week.

Minutes: George Boyajian made a motion to accept the minutes of the 4 August 2008 General Meeting as published in the *Scuttlebutt*. Joe Mensack seconded this, and the motion passed.

Officer Reports:

Commandant's Report: Earle Drake reported that he and Jack McLeod had presented a beautifully framed Certificate of Appreciation to Judy Spires, President of Acme Markets. Acme Markets has been very supportive in the Detachment's fund raising efforts this year, by allowing the Detachment members to solicit donations in front of their stores. Earle also reported on the successful Alliance picnic that was held in August. He also reported that donations were made to the Broomall Fire Company and the Newtown Square Fire Company. Earle Drake also mentioned that there is a need for members, especially new members, to become active in the Color Guard and Honor Guard. There was also discussion on the process of selecting the Marine of the Year.

A note of thanks was also read from Steve Udovich, from Warrior Weekend, for a recent donation made to that organization. Thank you letters were also read from the Disabled Veterans' Life Memorial Foundation and the Broomall Fire Company.

Judge Advocate: Dan Luty clarified the voting process in the selection of the Marine of the Year. Members are able to submit names of individual members for

consideration, and the three most recent recipients of this award will meet and make recommendations for a final list for consideration. The members will then vote by secret ballot on the Marine of the Year from the final list of candidates. This change had been previously approved and is included in the Detachment's Administrative Procedures. In another matter, Dan Luty mentioned that the charges brought against Jim Alleva have been referred to the Department of Pennsylvania of the Marine Corps League.

Chaplain: Chris Bush mentioned that Craig Allen and Bob Bunce, both of whom had been recuperating, were both in attendance at this meeting. He also reminded everyone to try and visit Bill Charleton at Presbyterian Home.

Sr. Vice: Jim Robinson reported that a bus trip to the Marine Corps Museum has been scheduled for 5 October 2008. The cost is \$45.00 per person, and the report time is 0730. He also indicated that the Marine Corps Birthday Ball is scheduled for 7 November 2008.

Jr. Vice: Jerry Leon, reporting for Jack McLeod, reported on the fund raising activity results from the past weekend at the Manoa SuperFresh, the Broomall PathMark, and Gentile's Market in Newtown Square.

Paymaster: Bob Spano provided the Paymaster's report, as of 31 August 2008. Bernie McGinley made a motion to accept the Paymaster's report as received. Wayne Barner seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Committee Reports:

Honor Guard: Wayne Barner reported that the Honor Guard participated in 17 funerals for veterans during August. This brings the total to 170 for the year so far.

Membership: Jim Robinson mentioned that a new member will be joining the Detachment. His name is Leo Carlin.

Nominations: Jerry Leon mentioned that the nomination process for next year's slate of officers will begin at next month's General Meeting. Those nominated must have been a member for at least one

year, and must have attended at least four meetings during the year. Anyone nominated for the position of Commandant must have previously served in an elected office.

Scouting: Jack Gingras mentioned that an Eagle Scout presentation will be conducted on 14 September. The new Eagle Scout is a member of Frank Mayer's troop. The Detachment will award its new challenge coin at this ceremony.

Young Marines: Bob Stanton reported that activity with the Young Marines is going well. A camping trip has just been completed, and the schedule for fall is ready to begin. Bob Stanton also expressed his appreciation to the Detachment for its support of the Young Marines program over the past fifteen years.
