#### The Legend Continues ...





The worst part of the arrest of Butler was the humiliation attached to the affair. Here was an American hero with thirty-three years of honorable military service to his country, with two Medals of Honor and sixteen other decorations, notified by telephone that he was under house arrest and confined to his residence. His personal command flag, 2 star, was lowered showing loss of command and he was the only American general to be arrested since the American Civil War. All for the crime of "Discourteous and unwarrantable utterances" as it was termed in Secretary of State, Henry Stimson's formal apology, in the name of the American People, to Benito Mussolini. The apology was quickly accepted by Mussolini with the hope that the affair was finally ended.

The other embarrassment was the court martial itself. Since a person must be tried by his seniors and there was only one major general in the Marines, Secretary of the Navy, Charles Adams, designated six rear admirals to hear the case at the Philadelphia Navy Yard where the trial was to be held. The "Powers in Washington" had set all of these upcoming procedures in motion but failed to take into account the American public. Washington was besieged with complaints from irate citizens who were furious that the government would treat an incorruptible patriot in this fashion. Lawyers volunteered their services for the defense without cost and prominent citizens offered to be witnesses for the defense, and with this outpouring for Butler, the government began rapidly trying to extract themselves from this predicament that they had brought upon themselves.

After publicly pressing for maximum severity, they changed their tact after two weeks of hostile public reaction and asked Butler's attorneys to negotiate a settlement rather than proceed with the trial. Butler and his attorneys wrote his own reprimand and this did not include an apology to Mussolini. After announcing the settlement, the Secretary of the Navy, Charles Adams, stated that Butler had received a milder punishment because of his "long record of brilliant service."

Even today, it is difficult to imagine the type of genius that thought of the plan to court martial a prominent and brilliant officer on such a charge.

Butler had planned to retire before the Mussolini affair and now hopes of being Commandant vanished and he did retire 22 September 1931.

#### <u>Selected May Dates of Marine Corps</u> <u>Historical Significance</u>

- **2 June 1918:** At dawn on this date, the crack German 28th Division attacked along the axis of the Paris-Metz road hitting the American 2d Division, including the 4th Marine Brigade. The Marines opened with deadly rifle fire and helped hand the German troops a setback which set the stage for Marine victory at Belleau Wood which would soon follow, although at great cost.
- **8 June 1995:** A Marine tactical recovery team from the 24th Marine Expeditionary Unit stationed on board the USS *Kearsarge* rescued a downed U.S. pilot, Captain Scott O'Grady, USAF, from Bosnian-Serb territory in Bosnia.
- 10 June 1898: The First Marine Battalion, commanded by LtCol Robert W. Huntington, landed on the eastern side of Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. The next day, Lt Herbert L. Draper hoisted the American flag on a flag pole at Camp McCalla where it flew during the next eleven days. LtCol Huntington later sent the flag with an accompanying letter to Colonel Commandant Charles Heywood noting that "when bullets were flying, ...the sight of the flag upon the midnight sky has thrilled our hearts."
- 12 June 1961: President John F. Kennedy signed a Presidential Proclamation calling for the American flag to be flown at the Marine Corps War Memorial in Arlington, Virginia, "at all times during the day and night." Discussions between the Attorney General's office and Marine Corps officials earlier in 1961 on improving the visibility and appearance of the monument led to the proposal to fly the Flag continuously, which by law could only be done by Congressional legislation or by Presidential proclamation.
- **15 June 1944:** Preceded by naval gunfire and carrier air strikes, the V Amphibious Corps assaulted the west coast of Saipan, Marianas Islands. By nightfall, the 2d and 4th Marine Divisions, moving against heavy opposition, had established a beachhead 10,000 yards wide and 1,500 yards deep.
- **20 June 1993:** The 24th Marine Expeditionary Unit returned to Mogadishu, Somalia, to stand ready to assist United Nations forces in maintaining peace in the war-torn country. Earlier that month, the 24th MEU had been ordered to cut short Exercise Eager Mace 93-2 in Kuwait to respond to possible contingency operations in Somalia.
- 25 June 1950: Shortly before dawn, eight divisions of the North Korean People's Army crossed the 38th Parallel and invaded the Republic of Korea. Within three days, the South Korean capital city of Seoul had been captured. On 30 June, President Harry S. Truman ordered a naval blockade of the Korean coast and authorized the sending of U.S. ground troops to Korea. Two days later, General Douglas MacArthur, the Commander in Chief Far East, formally requested that a Marine regimental combat team be deployed to the Far East.
- **25** June 1966: In Vietnam, Operation Jay began about 30 kilometers northwest of Hue, and lasted nine days. The 2d Battalion, 4th Marines landed north of the North Vietnamese 812th Main Force Battalion, and the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines landed south of the enemy's position. Caught in between the two Marine units, the enemy suffered over 80 dead in nine days of fighting.
- 26 June 1918: BGen James G. Harbord, the Commanding General of the 4th Marine Brigade, notified American Expeditionary Force Headquarters that Belleau Wood was "now U.S. Marine Corps entirely." After 20 days of combat, and at a cost of over 4,000 casualties, the 4th Brigade of Marines had proven its fighting heart. The grateful Commander of the French Sixth Army would soon decree that in all official correspondence, Belleau Wood would henceforth bear the name, "Bois de la Brigade de Marine."

He faced his final review of the troops at Quantico, Virginia as the band played, "There's a Long, Long Trail Awinding".

#### POST NOTE...

There is another story about why General Butler was not appointed Commandant. While fighting the Boxers in China, all men were ordered to defense positions to protect people and property. They found an American engineer hiding with the women in the English Quarter. Butler heard of this and hauled him out of his hideout and roughly manhandled him back to the defense positions. The man was Herbert Hoover and this might have accounted for the Butler/Hoover animosity.

Remembrance Ceremony: The May meeting is one in which those Detachment members who have passed away in the past year are remembered with a candle lighting ceremony. A candle is lit for all of those who have passed away in the past year. A bell tolls as each name is read, and then one candle is blown out for each member's name. Those remembered this year were Anthony Delgrippo, Henry Mummah, Ralph Lamarra, Charles Butler, Anthony Coladonato, and honorary member Art Mooney.

<u>Minutes</u>: Joe Mensack made a motion to approve the minutes of the 4 April 2011 general meeting as published in the *Scuttlebutt*. Bud Davis seconded the motion and the motion passed.

#### Officer Reports:

Adjutant: Jack Kelly reported that letters of appreciation for Detachment donations had been received from The YMCA of the Upper Main Line and the USO of Pennsylvania and Southern New Jersey. In addition, a card of thanks had been received from a family member whose loved one had been buried while the Honor Guard served at the gravesite.

<u>Commandant</u>: Dan Luty provided some general information on the Department Convention, to be held in June. A bus trip to Marine Headquarters at 8<sup>th</sup> an I Streets in Washington, D.C. is available for those attending the Convention, but reservations need to be made quickly, if interested. Dan Luty also mentioned that a new column will be included in the *Scuttlebutt*, with a list of members' names and any special skills or services that they can perform. Dan Luty also expressed his thanks to those members who were involved in the recent walk for the March of Dimes.

<u>Chaplain</u>: Chris Bush indicated that he had visited Tom Lynch, who is now out of the hospital. Chris Bush also mentioned that Tom Kerrigan and his wife Berenice still have some health issues, and reminded members to keep them in prayer. Chris commented that it was good to see Dave Brimble at the meeting.

<u>Jr. Vice</u>: Jack McLeod provided information on some fictitious groups that are allegedly collecting funds for veterans groups, but they are in fact misrepresenting who they are and what they do with the funds that are collected. Jack McLeod mentioned that he is cooperating with Acme Markets to identify these groups when they can be found. In our Detachment's Help Us Help Others (HUHO) campaign, Jack McLeod reported that six events have been held so far, and the shopping public has been generous with donations.

<u>Paymaster</u>: Bob Spano provided the paymaster's report as of 30 April 2011. He pointed out that \$1,000.00 had been donated to the USO of North Carolina for Jacksonville (Tarawa Terrace), to assist those military families that lost their homes in recent tornados in the south. This donation was from the budget's needy family fund. Another \$500.00 was sent to another needy family. George Boyajian made a motion to accept the paymaster's report as received. Several members seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

<u>Sr. Vice</u>: Bob Cosgrove was not in attendance, but members were asked to raise their hands if they were planning to attend the June meeting, and if they had not previously indicated their intent to attend. A count was necessary to determine how many will be attending the dinner meeting in June. The June meeting will be the Detachment's annual scholarship awards meeting for college students. It was also mentioned that the correct date for the June meeting is 6 June 2011, statrting at 1800

<u>Service Officer</u>: Con McGinley mentioned that he would not be able to assist with the bingo event at Coatesville this month, as he would be away at that time.

Junior Past Commandant: Earle Drake mentioned that an Americanism program had recently been presented at St. Norbert's Elementary School in Paoli, PA. Lloyd Spangler also participated with his bugle, and the students appreciated the presentation and the patriotic numbers played by Lloyd Spangler. Earle Drake reported that a display is currently in the Marple Library with an emphasis on Women in the Military. Two mannequins and two Women Marine uniforms had been loaned by the Pennsylvania Veterans Museum in Media, PA to

assist with this display. Earle Drake had participated in the Southeast District meeting in Downingtown on Sunday. He also mentioned that the attempt to establish a pistol team from the Delaware County MCL detachments has not seen sufficient interest so far.

#### **Committee Reports:**

Adopt-a-Highway: John Burfete mentioned that the first Adopt-a-Highway event had been held in April and it was successful, with a good turnout of members. The next event is scheduled for 12 June 2011.

<u>Color Guard</u>: Joe Conigliaro was not in attendance, due to illness, but Bob Spano reported that the Color Guard would be active on 5 May 2011 at Rose Tree Park for the National Day of Prayer. Other upcoming events include the Walk for the Wounded event on 21 May 2011 and the annual Memorial Day parade and other events on 30 May 2011.

<u>Home Association</u>: Bob Spano mentioned that assistance is needed each month in setting up the meeting room for the monthly meeting. Those who can help should arrive approximately an hour before the meeting begins to assist with the setting up for the meeting. Assistance is also needed after the meeting has concluded.

Anyone interested in having a biographical account of his or her time in the service and life outside of the service should contact the *News of Delaware County* and a reporter would then contact the interested person.

Charles (Bud) Davis was recognized for becoming a Life Member of the Detachment. Membership Chairman Jim Herbst presented Bud Davis with his Life Membership nameplate.

<u>Scholarships</u>: Wayne Williams mentioned that applications for the National MCL scholarships are due by 1 July 2011. Wayne Williams also announced that fourteen college students related to members had applied for Detachment scholarships this year. It had been determined at a recent officer staff meeting that there are sufficient funds available to award \$500.00

scholarships to all fourteen students, so all applicants will receive their scholarship awards at the June general meeting.

<u>Scouting</u>: Ed Seidl mentioned that there are two Eagle Scout presentations scheduled for May.

<u>Unfinished Business</u>: No items of unfinished business were raised.

New Business: Bob Spano reviewed the list of organizations that had been discussed at a recent officer staff meeting, and were approved and recommended for consideration for donations by the membership. The organizations recommended to receive funds are (1) Homes for Our Troops, Taunton, MA; (2) The Marine Corps League Foundation, Merrifield, VA; (3) Operation First Response, Inc., Culpeper, VA; (4) The Upper Darby Detachment Marine Corps League Auxiliary, Upper Darby, PA; (5) The USO, Philadelphia International Airport, Philadelphia, PA, and (6) The Wounded Warrior Regiment, Quantico, VA. George Boyajian made a motion to donate \$1,000.00 to each of these organizations. Bernie McGinley seconded the motion and the motion passed. In addition, Earle Drake made a motion to donate \$1,000.00 to the Johnny Michael Spann Marine Corps League Detachment in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. This Detachment is assisting those Marines and other service members who have recently been forced out of their homes due to heavy tornado activity in the Tuscaloosa area recently. Jim Robinson seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Good of the League/Announcements: Members were encouraged to consider participating in upcoming events, especially the Walk for the Wounded event on 21 May 2011 and the annual Memorial Day parade and other activities on 30 May 2011. The June general meeting is the annual scholarship awards dinner, and it is scheduled for 6 June 2011, beginning at 1800.

George Boyajian made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Several members seconded the motion and the motion passed. After the normal closing ceremonies, the meeting was adjourned at 2040.

Jim Donegan won the 50/50. Fifty-one members signed the logbook.
