#### **General Meeting Minutes – 7 March 2017**

**Commandant:** Commandant Dominic D'Alessandro opened the meeting at 1930. The regular opening ceremonies were conducted. Officers present were Commandant Dominic D'Alessandro, Sr. Vice Commandant Dominick Mattioni, Jr. Vice Commandant Jack McLeod, Judge Advocate Earle Drake, Paymaster Bob Spano, Adjutant Jack Kelly, Chaplain Chris Bush, Sergeant-at-Arms Charles (Bud) Davis, Service Officer Jim Herbst, Director Paul Donohue, and Junior Past Commandant Paul Ferguson.

**Application for Membership:** Jim Herbst mentioned that there was an application for membership. He introduced Claude Falcone, who had served in the U.S. Army and he is currently a member of American Legion Post #805. Chris Bush made a motion to accept Claude Falcone as an associate member and Bob Spano seconded the motion. The motion passed. Claude Falcone was then sworn in as an associate member of the Detachment by Commandant Dominic D'Alessandro.

**Minutes:** George Boyajian made a motion to accept the minutes of the 7 February 2017 general meeting as published in the *Scuttlebutt*. Bob Wells seconded the motion and the motion passed.

#### **Officer Reports:**

**Senior Vice Commandant:** Dominick Mattioni mentioned that he had looked into a Memorial Day event at the Mann Theatre scheduled for 7 May 2017. He had looked into transportation possibilities and had found that transportation was limited to private transportation and the use of SEPTA. He had sent out this information to the membership by e-mail. In reference to the Spring Dinner in June, he had looked into several variations of menus, but due to higher costs, he had decided to have the same menu as in 2016 with the cost remaining the same at \$12.00 per person. Dominick Mattioni also read possible recommendations to be considered for the Spring Dinner. These would be taken up at a later time in the meeting.

**Junior Vice Commandant:** Jack McLeod provided an overview of his activities for the Help Us Help Others (HUHO) Campaign for 2017. He has been contacting Acme stores for solicitation dates and he has been working with Acme management for approval of the tentative schedule. When the schedule has been finalized, it will be sent to the membership by e-mail. For those members without e-mail, the schedules will be sent out by regular mail. The first date for solicitation is 18 March 2017, at the Acme stores in Media and Granite Run. Jack McLeod mentioned that he and Bob Spano had reconciled their figures for the year 2016, and the final result is \$170,000.00 in HUHO collections in 2016.

**Paymaster:** Bob Spano reviewed the paymaster's report for the month of February 2016. He commented on the income for the month, as well as the expenses. He also suggested that the members should review the list of organizations listed on the back of the agenda.

These organizations would be considered for donations later in the meeting. George Boyajian made a motion to accept the paymaster's report as received. Chris Bush seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

**Adjutant:** Jack Kelly mentioned that letters of thanks for donations had been received from the USO of Pennsylvania and South Jersey in Philadelphia, PA, from the Toys for Tots Foundation in Triangle, VA, from the Gideons International, Nashville, TN and from the Semper Fi Fund in Oceanside, CA. Jack Kelly also provided information on the Spring Review for the Villanova University NROTC, scheduled for Tuesday, 18 April 2017. It was mentioned that an e-mail would be sent out to the membership to arrive at a count for those attending. The count is necessary for the University's planning.

**Judge Advocate:** Earle Drake began his report with his Americanism activity. He mentioned that the Americanism team would be making an Americanism/Flag History presentation at the Chester County Youth Center. A date has not yet been established for this event. Earle Drake reported that a Spring pistol match has been tentatively scheduled for 23 April at Delaware County Field and Stream. Approximately thirty-one MCL members from five Detachments are shooting. The start time is 0900, but shooters are asked to arrive early to help set up the targets.

In his position of Judge Advocate, Earle Drake mentioned that he needs to review any new By-laws or Administrative Procedures to ensure that the new action does not violate National, State, or Detachment procedures. He had reviewed the latest proposal from Sr. Vice Commandant Mattioni on the Spring Dinner in June and found the proposed changes to be specific to our Detachment and appear not to conflict with National or Department By-Laws or Administrative Procedures. There were informational sheets listing the proposed changes for review by all all members present. There was opening discussion on the proposals five through ten listed. Several members spoke about proposal number five, which was recommending a change in procedure in limiting the free dinner to the student and one guest. Those members who spoke on this favored the current procedure of the student and two guests free for the dinner. There was discussion on several of the other listed changes as well. Commandant D'Alessandro asked for a motion to vote on the proposed recommendations individually. Paul Donohue made a motion to vote on the recommendations individually, and the motion was seconded by Chris Bush. The motion carried. The votes were carried out by a show of hands.

The new procedures as recommended for the June General Membership Meeting by Sr. Vice Commandant Dominick Mattioni were:

Proposal #5 - Student and one guest are free. Currently the student and two guests are free. The vote was none in favor, 20 against. This proposal was not carried.

Proposal #6 - Reservation must be paid before final count day. Currently reservations can be paid on the day of the meeting. The vote was eleven in favor, thirteen against. This proposal was not carried.

Proposal #7 - Reservations will not be accepted the day after the final count is given to the caterer. The count twenty-three in favor, and none against. This proposal carried.

Proposal #8 - There will be no payments at the door.

Currently, a member or guest may pay at the door. The vote was eight in favor, and fourteen against. This proposal was not carried.

Proposal #9 - Payments may be made to the Senior Vice or Paymaster. Currently a payment can be made at the door payable to the MCL. It was decided that this was not necessary, since the result of Proposal #8 overrides this. No vote was taken on #9.

Proposal #10 - Payment returns will only be given for cancellations up to the final count day. Currently refunds are being granted after the final count day. The vote was sixteen in favor of this, and only one vote against. This proposal carried.

Earle Drake mentioned that the approved changes would be incorporated in section B-3 of the Detachment's Administrative Procedures section. The approved changes would be signed by the Commandant after they have been prepared by Earle Drake, Judge Advocate.

Service Officer: Jim Herbst mentioned that the next bingo game at the Coatesville Medical Center would be on Wednesday, 8 March 2017. The bingo game would be on the second Wednesday of the month from now on. He also mentioned that there would be a St. Patrick's Day event on Saturday, 11 March 2017 at the Coatesville Medical Center.

Committee Reports:

Color Guard: Wayne Williams reported that the Color Guard would be marching in the Springfield St. Patrick's Day Parade on 11 March 2017. The report time was given as 1030. The members who volunteered to march were Jerry McGuckin, Bob Wells, Bob Spano, Jack Kelly, and Wayne Williams.

Membership: Jim Herbst welcomed new associate member Claude Falcone again, and reminded the membership to keep on recruiting.

Property: Bob Spano mentioned that he had a red golf shirt available for purchase. He also mentioned that a red blazer, size 44 long, was available for anyone interested.

Scholarships: Wayne Williams mentioned that he has scholarship application forms for the Detachment and Department of Pennsylvania scholarship programs, but he has not yet received the forms for the National MCL scholarship program. He mentioned that he had received five applications so far for the Detachment scholarship program.

Scouting: Ed Seidl reported that there had been one Eagle Scout ceremony in February and four more Eagle Scout ceremonies were scheduled for the month of March.

Unfinished Business: Roger Godfrey referred to a picture that he had of "The Soldier's Cross" depicting a soldier recognizing a fallen comrade. Roger Godfrey's suggestion was to have a small replica prepared, possibly with member and sculptor Terry Jones working on it, and have the finished work placed in front of the chapel at the Delaware County Veterans Memorial in Newtown Square, PA. Bob Spano mentioned that this was only an idea at this point, and that it would have to be approved here, and if approved, we would then have to approach the Board of the

Delaware County Veterans Memorial for consideration. There was some discussion on this idea, with some in favor and some desiring more information. Cost was also a factor, but Roger Godfrey mentioned that there would be no cost to the Detachment. The Booth's Corner Farmers Market could possibly be assisting with the cost. Bob Spano made a motion to proceed with the idea of this project. Jim Herbst seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

New Business: In the awards category, Jim Herbst presented Certificates of Appreciation or Certificates of Meritorious Commendation to Joe Beal, Jerry McGuckin, Jack Gallagher, Roger Godfrey, Steve Kusner, Nick Repino, and Phil Spinelli. These members were awarded for their contributions to the Detachment during 2016. They were not present at the February awards general meeting.

Charitable Organizations: Bob Spano reviewed the list of organizations listed on the back of the agenda. These organizations were being suggested to the membership for consideration. They had been discussed and approved at a recent officers' staff meeting. George Boyajian made a motion to donate the funds as outlined. The organizations and the amounts to be donated are: (1) Fisher House Foundation, Rockville, MD (\$3,000.00); (2) The Injured Marine Semper Fi Fund, Oceanside, CA (\$3,000.00); Operation First Response, Culpepper, VA (\$3,000.00); and (4) The USO, Philadelphia International Airport, Philadelphia, PA (\$3,000.00). Dan Luty seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Good of the League: Bob Spano mentioned that a Marine named Fred Gray in Havertown has approached him with information on two cemetery plots being available to a veteran. The plots are located in Valley Forge Gardens. Anyone interested should contact Bob Spano for additional information.

Announcements: Commandant D'Alessandro mentioned that daylight savings time begins on Sunday, 12 March 2017. This means that the uniform changes to short sleeve shirts as of that date. He also mentioned the dates for the monthly flag raising at the Delaware County Memorial are 9 April, 21 May, 11 June, 9 July, 13 August, 10 September, 8 October, and 13 November 2017.

George Boyajian made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Several members seconded the motion and the motion passed. After the regular closing ceremonies, the meeting was adjourned at 2045.

Jim Herbst won the 50/50. Twenty-nine members signed the logbook.

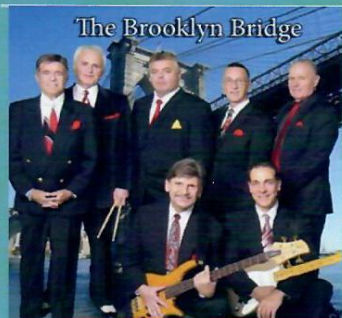
