General Smedley D. Butler Detachment #741 Marine Corps League General Meeting Minutes – 4 September 2018

Commandant: The meeting was opened by Commandant Jim Flynn at 1930. The regular opening ceremonies were conducted. Officers who were present were Commandant Jim Flynn, Senior Vice Commandant Dominick Mattioni, Paymaster Bob Spano, Adjutant Jack Kelly, Chaplain Chris Bush, Sergeant-at-Arms Charles (Bud) Davis, Service Officer Jim Herbst, Director Paul Donohue, Director Bill Kinney, Director Ben Sides, and Junior Past Commandant Dominic D'Alessandro.

<u>Minutes</u>: Bill Kinney made a motion to accept the minutes of the 7 August 2018 general meeting as published in the *Scuttlebutt*. Jim Herbst seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Officer Reports:

Adjutant: Jack Kelly reported that letters of thanks were received from several organizations that had received donations from the Detachment. Letters of thanks were received from the Semper Fi Fund, Oceanside, CA, from the Fisher House Foundation, Rockville, MD, from Homes for Our Troops, Taunton, ME, and from the National Conference on Ministry to the Armed Forces, Arlington, VA. It was also mentioned that the Executive Director of this organization had expressed a desire to come to one of our meetings and meet the membership. This request will be reviewed at the next officers' staff meeting. In addition, two notes of thanks were received from families whose veteran loved one received final honors by the Honor Guard. In personal remarks, Jack Kelly mentioned that he would be joining his local church's Board of Elders, and that its meetings would be the same night as the Detachment's meetings. Jack Kelly mentioned that he would not be a candidate to continue as the Adjutant in the 2019 year when the nominations for officer positions are opened in the October, November, and December general meetings.

Senior Vice Commandant: Dominick Mattioni reported that the Combined Veterans Alliance picnic that was recently held was a success. The food was great and the selection of chicken and pulled pork seemed to be popular choices. It was reported that everyone had a good time. Dominick Mattioni mentioned that he had posted photos of the picnic under his Facebook page. He also mentioned that the Detachment's annual Marine Corps Birthday Ball is scheduled for 10 November 2018 at the Paxon Hollow Country Club. The member cost is \$50.00 per person and payments are due by 5 November 2018.

Junior Vice Commandant: Jack McLeod was not present, but Commandant Jim Flynn mentioned that \$6,152.00 had been collected in the Help Us Help Others (HUHO) Campaign over the past Labor Day weekend. Jim also announced that he was looking for volunteers for the following weekend at the Newtown Square and Lawrence Park Acme Markets. Those wanting to volunteer were asked to see Jim Flynn following the meeting.

<u>Paymaster</u>: Bob Spano reviewed the Paymaster's Report as provided in the handout for tonight's meeting. The income and disbursement figures for the month of August 2018 were provided. Bob Spano also mentioned that the dues of \$30.00 for all non-Life Members are now due. He also reviewed the list of charitable organizations that would be considered later in the meeting. George Boyajian made a motion to accept the Paymaster's Report as received. Paul Donohue seconded the motion and the motion passed.

<u>Chaplain</u>: Chris Bush mentioned that Jack McLeod was in a local rehab facility and that Joe Tier was also in a local hospital. Wes Tomlinson was reported to have been under the weather recently, but he is apparently feeling better. Chris Bush requested the membership to keep these individuals in prayer.

Service Officer: Jim Herbst mentioned that a picnic was scheduled for 8 September 2018 at the Coatesville Medical Center. He mentioned the Claude Falcone and Chris Bush would be attending, as well as members of the Auxiliary. The Chester County Detachment of the Marine Corps League would also be there. Jim Herbst also mentioned that the regular monthly bingo game was scheduled for 12 September 2018 at the Coatesville Medical Center.

<u>Director Kinney</u>: Bill Kinney mentioned that the monthly Flag Raising ceremony at the Delaware County Veterans Memorial was scheduled for 9 September 2018 at 1700. Participants were asked to report at 1630. He reviewed certain aspects of this month's ceremony, and then he mentioned that in October, there may be as many as eleven flags raised and lowered. Additional volunteers would be appreciated for this number of individuals to be honored. A Color Guard and Honor Guard detail would be needed at this event at 1200 and volunteers are needed for this event. Bill Kinney also provided information on the annual Delaware County Veterans Memorial Dinner, scheduled for 14 November 2018, at the Springfield Country Club. A Color Guard Detachment is needed for this dinner, and Paul Donohue will be there representing a Continental soldier.

Bill Kinney asked for volunteers to lower the flag at sunrise at the Memorial on 11 September and then raise the flag again at sunset. Bob Spano and Ben Sides volunteered for this responsibility.

<u>Director Sides</u>: Ben Sides reported that the Honor Guard had participated in four funerals for deceased veterans during the month of August. He mentioned the Hour Guard had one more funeral earlier that day (4 September) and one more was scheduled for the following day.

Committee Reports:

Adopt-a-Highway: Jim Flynn reported that the most recent Adopt-a-Highway event had been rained out, so the event has been rescheduled for 16 September 2018. Members will be contacted by e-mail prior to the date, and volunteers would be needed for this event.

Americanism: Earle Drake did not have a report on the Americanism program, but he mentioned that Peg Walz had donated eight new CD's to the Detachment library. These are books on CD's that can be listened to by anyone interested in borrowing any of them. He provided some basic information on the titles and contents of several of the selections. Those interested should contact Earle Drake.

Color Guard: Wayne Williams reported on several upcoming events in which the Color Guard would be needed. The first one scheduled was the Blood, Sweat, and Cheer event on 6 October 2018, followed by the Detachment's annual Marine Corps Birthday Ball on 10 November 2018. The next event would be the annual Delaware County Veterans Memorial Association Dinner, scheduled for 14 November 2018. Wayne Williams asked for volunteers for several positions for these important dates.

<u>Property</u>: Bob Spano reported that additional flag pins had been ordered and received for use in the Americanism program. He also mentioned that the flag collection boxes had been repainted and had been relocated in several locations in Marple and Newtown Townships. He also mentioned that the air conditioning had been repaired in the room in which the Auxiliary meets. In an effort to try to find a new meeting location, Bob Spano and Jim Flynn were going to look at the Newtown Township Municipal Building to determine the feasibility of that location for future Detachment and Auxiliary meetings.

<u>Unfinished Business</u>: No items of unfinished business were raised.

New Business:

<u>Announcements</u>: Bob Spano mentioned again that dues are now due for any member who is not a Life Member of the Detachment.

George Boyajian made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Bill Kinney seconded the motion and the motion was passed. The regular closing ceremonies were conducted. The meeting was adjourned at 2005. Twenty-five members signed the logbook. Jack Kelly won the 50/50.
